Schlesinger wins Western Swing Song of the Year

His version of old Melody Masters' song

Fiddler and vocalist Paul Schlesinger of Taylor is the winner of the 2016 Western Swing Song of the Year for the tune, "You Were Meant to Ruin My Dreams."

The song is a track on his CD, Paul Schlesinger and his Knights of Texas Swing.

The presentation occurred during the 21st Annual Will Rogers Academy of Western Artists awards banquet on Thursday, March 16, at the Brown-Lupton Ballroom on the Texas Christian University Campus in Fort Worth.

"You Were Meant to Ruin My Dreams" was written in 1949 by lyricist Cecil R. "Butterball" Harris and composer Arlie A. Carter, who were band members of Jimmy Heap and the Melody Masters from Taylor.

The song was originally recorded by the Melody Masters for Imperial Records, and sung by fiddler Perk Williams of Chriesman.

Williams would later become a close friend and mentor to Schlesinger.

All involved with the original recording are now deceased.

Schlesinger says, "The original recording is a tad slower than my version, and by today's recording standards sounds a bit primitive.'

"It sold well enough regionally, but was not a hit in 1949. In 2011, Cecil Harris told me he wrote the song to fit around the heartbreak theme, using a 'hook line' that would hopefully catch the public's fancy. I always liked the song and occasionally performed it live at shows and dances.'


